Holy Maternity of St. Anna/ Conception of St. Anne Immaculate Conception

Dec. 8- We keep the feast of the Conception of Saint Anne/ Conception of the Theotokos, known in the West as the Immaculate Conception. Declared a dogma in 1854 by Pope Pius IX, the Immaculate Conception was taught by many Church Fathers and spiritual writers for centuries. In the Eastern Churches, this is normally kept on December 9, in order to emphasize that though sinless, Our Lady is still inferior to Christ, Who alone has a perfect pregnancy (March 25-December 25). However, the Latin Church preferred the date of December 8, giving Our Lady a perfect pregnancy (December 8 - September 8). Because the United States is dedicated to the Immaculate Conception, our Byzantine Catholic Church has accepted the December 8th date in America. The dogma teaches this: the Blessed Virgin Mary "in the first instance of her conception, by a singular privilege and grace granted by God, in view of the merits of Jesus Christ, the Savior of the human race, was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin. (Pope Pius IX)."

What does this mean? The Catholic Encyclopedia tells us: **Mary was preserved exempt from all stain of original sin** at the first moment of her animation, and sanctifying grace was given to her before sin could have taken effect in her soul.

The formal active essence of original sin was not removed from her soul, as it is removed from others by baptism; it was excluded, it never was in her soul. Simultaneously with the exclusion of sin, the state of original sanctity, innocence, and justice, as opposed to original sin, was conferred upon her, by which gift every stain and fault, all depraved emotions, passions, and debilities, essentially pertaining to original sin, were excluded. But she was not made exempt from the temporal penalties of Adam — from sorrow, bodily infirmities, and death. The immunity from original sin was given to Mary by a singular exemption from a universal law through the same merits of Christ, by which other men are cleansed from sin by baptism. Mary needed the redeeming Savior to obtain this exemption, and to be delivered from the universal necessity and debt of being subject to original sin. The person of Mary, in consequence of her origin from Adam, should have been subject to sin, but, being the new Eve who was to be the mother of the new Adam, she was, by the eternal counsel of God and by the merits of Christ, withdrawn from the general law of original sin. Her redemption was the very masterpiece of Christ's redeeming wisdom. He is a greater redeemer who pays the debt that it may not be incurred than he who pays after it has fallen on the debtor.

The feast of the Conception of Saint Anne originates in the monasteries of Palestine in the late 600s; it spread through the Syriac and Byzantine Churches so that by 1166 it was a holy day of obligation in the Byzantine Empire with no work allowed. In the texts of this feast, Mary is acclaimed as all-holy, immaculate, sinless, and most pure. Icons of "The Conception of St. Anne" shows SS. Joachim and Anne embracing at the Golden Gate after being told by angels that they would conceive a daughter who would become the mother of the Messiah.



"Am I not here, who is your mother? Do not be disturbed."

In 1523, just two years after the Aztec capital of Tenochtitlan (Mexico City) fell to Hernán Cortés and his Conquistadors, the first Roman Catholic missionaries arrived to begin the religious conquest of Mexico.

Among their first converts was Cuauhtlatoatzin (The Talking Eagle) baptized with the Christian name Juan Diego. On the chilly morning of December 9, 1531, Juan Diego crossed the barren hill called Tepeyac to attend Mass. He was brought to a sudden halt by a blinding light and the sound of beautiful music. Before him appeared an astounding vision--a beautiful dark-skinned woman who, calling the Indian "my son", declared herself to be the Virgin Mary, the mother of Jesus Christ. She told Juan Diego it was her desire to have a church built on Tepeyac hill, and asked him to relay that message to Bishop Juan de Zumarraga. The purpose of Juan Diego's original name was now revealed, as he had to speak on behalf of Our Lady to the Spanish bishop.



It was no easy task for the humble Indian to be granted an audience with the top prelate, but the persistent Juan Diego was finally admitted. The incredulous Bishop demanded that he be provided with some proof of the unlikely encounter. On December 12, while rushing to find a priest to attend his dying uncle, he took a short cut across the hill. The Virgin once again appeared and Juan Diego told her of the Bishop's request. The Virgin instructed him to pick roses from the usually barren and desolate hill and deliver them to Zumarraga as the sign.

Juan Diego gathered up the miraculous blossoms in his mantle and hurried off to complete his mission. Once again before the Bishop, he let the roses spill out before him. Not only were the roses from the Spaniards' native Castile, but to their astonishment a perfect image of the Blessed Mother was revealed emblazoned on Juan Diego's cloak. Juan Diego's mantle, carefully preserved in the new Basilica, has been subjected to extensive analysis over the years. Experts have authenticated the fabric as dating to the 16th century, but have been unable to determine the type of pigment from which the image was rendered.

To this day, no one has been able to replicate the image, and the humble cactus cloth has survived pollution, acid, a bomb attack, and has not deteriorated at all, even though such cloaks usually collapse within two decades! Skeptics are quick to denounce the Virgin's appearance on Tepeyac, the very site of an Aztec temple dedicated to Tonatzin (earth goddess, mother of the gods and protectress of humanity) which had been devastated by order of Bishop Zumarraga. But Our Lady came to Tepeyac to conquer the old religion, while sanctifying a traditional place of prayer. Aztec religion believed in a cosmos that was frightening, which needed human blood from the sacrifice of tens of thousands of people every year in order to keep the universe in its proper balance. When the Spaniards toppled the Aztec altars, the Mexican nations awaited their destruction: but it did not come. Yet they could not relate to the new Spanish religion either, and the people were living in despair, confusion and anxiety. Now, this new Mother of God came to them. She wore their clothing, her skin was their color, she spoke in their Nahuatl language, she was pregnant with a new life, and she called the people her children and little ones. She encouraged them to worship her Son, the true God, and within a few years eight million people converted to Catholicism.
