The MISSION SOCIETY is pleased to present our beautiful NEW 2025 Easter card with the icon of Jesus the Good Shepherd. The card has many OLPH connections! The icon was made by iconographer Britta Prinzivalli brittworks.com at the request of our own Catechesis of the Good Shepherd group, a national program which we use for our preschoolers and kindergarten children. The group provided input on the colors used and the original icon is now displayed in their classroom! The pysanky eggs inside the card were made by the children of our parish. As has been the case since 2022, 100% of your card purchases & donations go to "UKRAINE RELIEF". The eparchy (diocese) of Mukachevo will use it to help over 400,000 refugees from eastern Ukraine with housing; clothing; school supplies for children; psychological support for refugee children & adults; food parcels & expenses for heating.

A packet of 5 cards sells for \$15 including envelopes. Each packet of cards includes a prayer list. Fill out the slip with the names of the recipients and return by mail or drop them by the parish office no later than Palm Sunday, April 13th. This gives us time to scan and e-mail them to Ukraine. Bishop Teodor will place all these names on the altar at Holy Cross Cathedral in Ukraine & pray for your intentions at the Divine Liturgy on Easter Sunday.

The Sign of the Cross by Romano Guardini

When we cross ourselves, let it be with a real sign of the cross. Instead of a small cramped gesture that gives no notion of its meaning, let us make a large unhurried sign, from forehead to breast, from shoulder to shoulder, consciously feeling how it incudes the whole of us, our thoughts, our attitudes, our body and soul, every part of us at once, how it consecrates and sanctifies us.

It does so because it is the Sign of the universe and the sign of our redemption. On the cross Christ redeemed mankind. By the cross he sanctifies man to the last shred and fiber of His being. We make the sign of the cross before we pray to collect and compose ourselves and to fix our minds and hearts and wills upon God. We make it when we finish praying in order that we may hold fast the gift we have received from God. In temptations we sign ourselves to be strengthened; in dangers, to be protected. The cross is signed upon us in blessings in order that the fulness of God's life may flow into the soul and fructify and sanctify us wholly.

Think of these things when you make the sign of the cross. It is the holiest of all signs. Make a large cross, taking time, thinking what you do. Let it take in your whole being—body, soul, mind, will, thoughts, feelings, your doing and not-doing—and by signing it with the cross strengthen and consecrate the whole in the strength of Christ, in the name of the triune God.

What Will be Your Choice by Laurie Bienz

In 2023, during lent, Jesus brought me into His passion so I could see it from a different view point. I will never see the Lord's passion the same way ever again.

I'm standing before the judge. "You are guilty! You are sentenced to death." Someone stands beside me and places His arm across my shoulders. I hear Him tell the judge, "I accept the judgement and sentence in her place." I look up and meet the compassionate gaze of Jesus.

I'm taken to the courtyard and chained to a post. The guard orders, "Thirty-nine lashes." As I wait for the lash to fall, a shadow falls across me, and a voice whisperers in my ear, "I will take the lashing for you." I look up and see Jesus standing over me.

"Why?" I ask. "I can bear the lashes, you cannot," was His gentle reply. There He stood, holding onto the post, sheltering me in His shadow.

"Why?" I ask again. In a gentle voice He replies, "I choose to do this." The guard takes me out to the street, throws me down beside a very large cross and orders me, "pick up that cross!" I try to lift the cross, but I am unable to. Again, the guard yells at me, "pick up that cross!!" Again, I attempt to lift the cross. Again, I fail. Then Jesus tells me, "This cross is too heavy. I will carry it for you." Lifting me to my feet, and picking up my cross, together we begin the walk up to calvary.

I whisper, "Why are you doing this?" His reply, "I choose to." We reach the top of Golgotha; He sets the cross down. The captain reads the list of my offenses and my sentence. Jesus lays His arm across my shoulders and tells the guard, "I am taking her place." He lays down on the cross and lets Himself be nailed to it. His cross is raised. I whisper, "No! I belong there not you!" I hear Him take His last breath. I am lost. I search for something. I go to His tomb, it is empty. I look up and down the roads. I still cannot find it. Then I see a bright light on the mountain. As I get closer, I see Jesus in all His glory, His wounds shining bright. I run to Him. He takes me in His arms. (continued on next page)

(continued from previous page) Again, I ask, "Why? Tell me why! I don't understand!" With a look filled with love, He answers, "I give you a choice out of my deep, abiding love for you." Setting me down, He hooks to the left. I follow His gaze and see pain and darkness and eternal separation from Him. He looks to the right. I follow His gaze and see light, joy and eternal life with Him.

I watch as He is taken up into the clouds, and in the depths of my soul I hear Him asking me, "What will be your choice?"



Lent is a journey to the cross. Jesus wants you to pick up your cross and follow Him. He wants you to learn virtues through carrying your cross. So one must stop and think about their crosses and what they mean! T hese small crosses are being given out today to help us deepen our trust and confidence that Jesus is walking with us on our journeys.
