

Ask Father Chris: Pope Francis recently created a number of cardinals. Are there any Eastern Catholic ones?

Yes, there are several. In the last consistory, the pope named a Ukrainian Catholic from Australia and a Syro-Malabar Catholic from India. There are now two cardinals from the Byzantine Catholic Churches: one each from the Romanian and Ukrainian Churches; one each from the Chaldean, Ethiopic, and Maronite Churches; and two from the Syro-Malabar Church, one of whom will soon be 80 and so ineligible to elect a new pope. By the way, each cardinal is assigned a parish church in the diocese of Rome, as they originally represented the clergy of the diocese who used to elect the pope.


Sunday of Orthodoxy

Today we celebrate the "triumph of orthodoxy", meaning of the true faith. It celebrates the final victory over iconoclasm in 842, after 130 years of repeated struggles. The Synod of Constantinople had reaffirmed the Seventh Ecumenical Council's teaching on the proper use of images in Christian worship, and to celebrate the event the population of Constantinople took part in a huge procession from the Blachernae Church to Hagia Sophia, carrying icons and other images which had been hidden away in homes and monasteries and now could be restored to the churches. Every parish holds a similar procession today, as the Council had decreed that the first Sunday of Lent, which was the date of that first procession, would include this remembrance. Today, the service reflects both the original feast, Sunday of the Prophets, and the triumph of orthodox belief over all heresies.

Iconoclasm teaches that the Word of God as Incarnate in Jesus cannot be represented in art, as the divine should not be represented in any way. In this, it reflects both Jewish and Muslim teachings, and raises questions then about the Incarnation: did God truly become a human being in Jesus or not? This underlies all iconoclastic tendencies, rejecting the great gift of the incarnation through which we are offered salvation. Iconoclasm was also a reaction to the claims of miracles accompanying icons, and excessive piety which seemed to veer very close to idol-worship. Much of the ancient Eastern Christian art was lost in this purge. The treasury of Saint Catherine's Monastery in Sinai – which escaped the destruction - gives us a glimpse of what we have lost.

Pope Gregory III condemned the heresy, but his messengers to the Emperor were imprisoned. Finally, Empress Irene, Pope Hadrian I, and Patriarch Tarasios convoked the Seventh Council at Nicaea in 786-87. This Council reaffirmed the classic Christian defense of icons:

"We define that the holy icons, whether in color, mosaic, or some other material, should be exhibited in the holy churches of God, on the sacred vessels and liturgical vestments, on the walls, furnishings, and in houses and along the roads, namely the icons of our Lord God and Savior Jesus Christ, that of our Lady the Theotokos, those of the venerable angels and those of all saintly people. Whenever these representations are contemplated, they will cause those who look at them to commemorate and love their prototype. We define also that they should be kissed and that they are an object of veneration and honor (timitiki proskynisis), but not of real worship (latreia), which is reserved for Him Who is the subject of our faith and is proper for the divine nature. The veneration accorded to an icon is in effect transmitted to the prototype; he who venerates the icon, venerated in it the reality for which it stands".



The **MISSION SOCIETY** is pleased to present our beautiful *NEW* 2025 Easter card with the icon of **Jesus the Good Shepherd**. The card has *many* OLPH connections! The icon was made by iconographer Britta Prinzivalli <u>brittworks.com</u> at the request of our own *Catechesis of the Good Shepherd* group, a national program which we use for our preschoolers and kindergarten children. The group provided input on the colors used and the original icon is now displayed in their classroom! The pysanky eggs inside the card were made by the children of our parish. As has been the case since 2022, 100% of your card purchases & donations go to "**UKRAINE RELIEF**". The eparchy (diocese) of Mukachevo will use it to help over 400,000 refugees from eastern Ukraine with housing; clothing; school supplies for children; psychological support for refugee children & adults; food parcels & expenses for heating.

A packet of 5 cards sells for \$15 including envelopes. Each packet of cards includes a prayer list. Fill out the slip with the names of the recipients and return by mail or drop them by the parish office no later than Palm Sunday, April 13th. This gives us time to scan and e-mail them to Ukraine. Bishop Teodor will place all these names on the altar at Holy Cross Cathedral in Ukraine & pray for your intentions at the Divine Liturgy on Easter Sunday. www.missionboronyavo.org
