Guidelines for Volunteering at Our Lady of Perpetual Help: A volunteer is a valued part of the church. The volunteer should be at least 18 years of age. If under 18, the volunteer should be accompanied by a parent or have been given permission by the parent to perform volunteer activities while supervised by another adult. All volunteers must be approved by the Pastor. At the Pastor's discretion, he can request letters of reference or additional information prior to approval. All volunteers older than age 18 must complete a background check with the Eparchy of Phoenix and must complete the annual requirement for Safe Environment training. For parishioners who are new to the parish, we ask for regular participation in the parish, the Holy Sacraments and Divine Liturgy for a period of one year before volunteering with Eastern Christian Formation, the Choir, or as an Altar Server.

MANDATORY SAFE ENVIRONMENT ONLINE TRAINING FOR ALL THE VOLUNTEERS Reminder: PLEASE, CHECK your Safe Environment Compliance Certificate Expiration date. Please note that Online Virtus training for many will be expiring within August-Sept-October. The Eparchy's revised Safe Environment Policy no longer allows for lapses in compliance either in Virtus training or in background screenings - for ALL OLPH VOLUNTEERS AND EXPLORER YOUTH GROUP LEADERS. Anyone falling out of compliance at any point must immediately cease from their designated area of service at OLPH until such time as they are in compliance once again. No one - not members of the clergy, volunteers, educators, employees etc. - may serve for even one day when out of SEP compliance. Thank you for your vigilance in this matter.

Jan 17th – Anthony the Great was a wealthy Egyptian born around 251 AD. He sold all his possessions and went into the desert to live in solitude with God. The temptations he endured continually from Satan for the span of twenty years were terrible, and well-documented. Anthony triumphed over the devil, and through his ascetic struggles he attained the height of *dispassion*.

A multitude of people followed him: Egyptians say that the desert was transformed into a city as a result. He became the governor, lawgiver, and master-trainer of all the citizens of this newly-formed city of monks and nuns living in cloisters and hermitages. Anthony did go back to the cities to defend the Faith against the Arian heresy, and he also converted many pagans. He lived to be 105 years old despite his penances and limited diet. He was very popular in colonial New Mexico / Colorado, where he was honored as *San Antonio Abbate*; the Spanish colonists found his desert life of faith to be an inspiration to them living in the high mountain deserts and bereft of the Sacraments due to the shortage of priests.

Sayings of Saint Anthony the Great "The truly intelligent man pursues one sole objective: to obey and to conform to the God of all. With this single aim in view, he disciplines his soul, and whatever he may encounter in the course of his life, he gives thanks to God for the compass and depth of His providential ordering of all things.

"Men are often wrongly called intelligent. Intelligent men are not those who are erudite in the sayings and books of the wise men of old, but those who have an intelligent soul and can discriminate between good and evil. They avoid what is sinful and harms the soul; and with deep gratitude to God they resolutely adhere by dint of practice to what is good and benefits the soul. These men alone should truly be called intelligent."

January 18 - Cyril of Alexandria (c. 376 – 444) was the Patriarch of Alexandria from 412 to 444. He came to power when the city was at its height of influence and power within the Roman Empire. Cyril wrote extensively and was a leading protagonist in the Christological controversies of the later 4th and 5th centuries. He was a central figure in the First Council of Ephesus in 431, which led to the deposition of Nestorius as Patriarch of Constantinople and recognition of Mary as Theotokos, Mother of God.

Cyril is counted among the Church Fathers and the Doctors of the Church, and his reputation

within the Christian world has resulted in his titles Pillar of Faith and Seal of all the Fathers. According to Cyril's theology, there were two states for the Son: the state that existed prior to the Son (or Word/Logos) becoming enfleshed in the person of Jesus and the state that actually became enfleshed. Thus, only the Logos incarnate suffered and died on the Cross and therefore the Son was able to suffer without suffering. Cyril's concern was that there needed to be continuity of the divine subject between the Logos and the incarnate Word—and so in Jesus

Christ the divine Logos was really present in the flesh and in the world. Nestorius denied this and would only grant Mary the title of Christotokos, Mother of Jesus Christ, the Man. It is interesting that a number of Protestant sectarians of our own day invoke the heretic Nestorius because of their determination to rebuke Catholic and Orthodox devotion to Mary as Theotokos!
