The OLPH Prayer Warriors make intercessory prayer a daily commitment. We started out with a small handful of soldiers and have grown to pack of 18 in our "prayer war room." Before the pandemic, our team of adults and children prayed Holy Scriptures together at church on Sundays before Divine Liturgy; however, in recent years we have been meeting via Zoom. The Zoom format has enabled church members living outside of Albuquerque or who are health-compromised to join in. Besides our weekly themed virtual gatherings and monthly rosaries, we pray on our own throughout the week for myriad intentions. We have stormed heaven for conversions, healings and healthcare providers, law enforcement workers and all first responders, prodigals, victims of elder abuse, reconciliations among family members, our church leadership, immigration matters, world events, natural disasters, marriages, births, the repose of souls, financial and professional breakthroughs, working conditions, the recovery of cars, traveling mercies, jobs, houses and personal property, pets, and the general wellbeing of all our OLPH family. We have come to Him in raw need and sincerity, and we have witnessed Him answer our prayers, thereby fortifying our Faith and faith. It has been exciting and edifying to experience the love of our Lord and of our Blessed Mother through His Presence, His Word, and His answers to our fervent prayers. The Prayer Warriors is open to women, men, and children, and we welcome your service! Praise God for raising up a group of mighty warriors committed to the belief that through Him, in Him, with Him, and toward Him, prayer moves worlds. Next week we will begin the Fast of Saint Philip, the 40-day preparation for Christmas. In Slavonic, this is called "Filipovka". The traditional Fast calls for abstinence from meat on Monday, Wednesday and Friday, with a strict fast from meat and dairy products on Christmas Eve, December 24. Once Halloween has passed, Christmas sales begin in stores, online, and on television. This forty-day preparation gives an opportunity to focus on the coming of Jesus Christ, not the orgy of gift-buying and giving. Think now of what you can do to prepare your soul for the birth of our Savior.

He was surprised by guards that kidnapped & jailed him. Before facing death, he prayed before the icon. The icon is once again the work of Iconographer Britta Prinzivalli. brittworks.com 100% of your card purchases & donations go to "UKRAINE RELIEF". The eparchy (diocese) of Mukachevo continues to serve thousands of refugees displaced by the fighting in the south and east who have sought food & shelter in the Transcarpathian Oblast of Ukraine. Your Christmas card purchases & donations helps refugees with basic needs. A packet of 5 cards sells for \$10 including envelopes. Each packet of cards includes a prayer list. Fill out the slip with the names of the recipients and return by mail or drop them by the parish office no later than Wednesday, December 20th. This gives us time to scan and e-mail them to Ukraine. Bishop Nil will place all these names on the altar at Holy Cross Cathedral in Ukraine & pray for your intentions at the Divine Liturgy on Christmas Day. In July 2023, Ukraine passed legislation moving its official Christmas holiday to December 25, further distancing itself from the traditions of the Putin-aligned Russian Orthodox Church, which celebrates the holiday on January 7. Synaxis of St Michael and All Angels

November 8 is the feast of Saint Michael and all the angels. Pope Gregory I listed the seven archangels as: Michael, Gabriel, Raphael, Uriel (or Anael), Simiel, Oriphiel, and Raguel. The feast itself is ancient, being set up by the Council of Laodicea in 363-64 AD. The day was established in November, the ninth month after March (with which the year began in ancient times) since there are Nine Ranks of Angels. The eighth day of the month was chosen for the Synaxis of all the Bodiless Powers of Heaven since the Day of the Dread Last Judgment is called the Eighth Day by the holy Fathers and Jesus had said that after the end of this age will come the Eighth Day, and then "the Son of Man shall come in His Glory and all the holy Angels with Him" (Mt. 25:31). Also, Saint Michael is expected to be helping to judge the souls at the Last Judgment. He is often shown holding the scales of justice while defeating Satan.

The nine choirs of angels were listed by Pseudo-Dionysius, an important spiritual writer from the late 300s as the Seraphim, Cherubim, Thrones, Dominions, Virtues, Powers, Principalities, Archangels and Angels. The Seraphim attend God's throne in the heavenly Liturgy (Isaiah 6:1-8). While western art has reduced the awesome Cherubim to chubby little babies, in Scripture they are far more impressive: six-winged, and four faces: that of a lion (representative of all wild animals), an ox (domestic animals), a man (humanity), and an eagle (birds), from where we get the symbols of the Four Evangelists of the Gospels. Thrones carry God's Throne in heaven, and serve the wishes of Our Lord Jesus Christ. Dominions are shown as having two wings but carrying orbs or scepters. They organize the guardian angels. Virtues are the angels through whom God's signs and miracles are made in creation. Powers fight demons and are shown with shields and swords. Principalities are shown wearing crowns and carrying scepters. They organize bands of angels, and fulfill the orders of higher-ranking angels or God Himself. Archangels serve as messengers of God, guard countries, and often help with Christian armies fighting evil forces. Angels serve as messengers to individuals and from their ranks come the personal guardian angels assigned to protect the billions of human beings.

Saint Michael is invoked for protection of police, armed forces, grocers, and against the devil. In the ancient Church he was also the one who helped pass judgment on souls after death, and he is still invoked for healing. Saint Raphael is known especially for healing and conquering evil, from his adventures in the Book of Tobit with Tobias. He is also the helper of people who emigrate from their homelands, doctors, counselors, social workers, and against nightmares. Saint Gabriel is the patron saint of communications, stamp collectors, postal workers, and diplomats.
